I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on the very high standard of achievement demonstrated in the reading, writing and mathametics Key Stage 2 assessment last year.

Following a price increase from Hertfordshire Catering Company, the following charges will be applicable from April '24 :-


KS2 (Years 3-6) : £3:35

Years 3&4 enjoyed seeing signs of spring in the woods, including catkins and wild garlic. They made some fantastic shelters to shield us from the rain. They also created beads by cutting elder branches using secateurs and then hollowing out the pith using palm drills.







WWF Zoom

On Wednesday, KS2 joined the WWF zoom meeting, which focused on biomes around the world and the plants and animals that live in each one. There was an emphasis on conservation and human impact on the environment. Animals on the endangered list were also discussed. Later in the zoom meeting, the focus moved onto wild animals within the UK. The children found this part really interesting and enjoyed identifying all the different species around the country. They had to vote for particular animals or groups of animals that they wanted to save from extinction.
