This week, Ophelia has been very brave by doing some tricky rock climbing!















We found mole hills in the field, listened to lots of different birds singing in the trees and we saw dragonflies flying over the river.

When we arrived back at school, we spent the rest of the afternoon playing in the mud kitchen and building dens in the school garden.

Spotlight on Learning

This week, we hear from Year 1&2!



The children have been so busy this half term! In our English lessons, we read 'Julian is a Mermaid', a story about a boy who is fascinated by the mermaid costumes at a carnival he goes to. The children enjoyed sharing the story, creating their own carnival headdresses and dancing to traditional carnival music. They developed their vocabulary throughout their learning and created some beautiful poems.







Our Geography topic is 'Kenya', and the children have been enjoying learning about the geography of Kenya and comparing this to the U.K. They have recently learned about the 'Big 5' and worked in groups to create fantastic factual posters about each of these animals. The children also drew some detailed maps of a national park, painted African animals using watercolour and wrote postcards describing their experiences with the Maasai tribe.



In R.E. we have been learning about how and why Christians celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit. The children have explored the story of Pentecost and how this is celebrated in church. We have also been thinking about the 'Fruits of the Spirit' as the special gifts we have inside of us. The children all chose a 'fruit of the spirit' to decorate the tree in our reflection area.

In Science, the children have been identifying different animal groups and their structures. This week, we explored birds. After some research in the classroom, we made our very own binoculars and went for a spot of bird watching. Perhaps you could make a list of all the birds you see over the half term?
