- Children can only be released to a parent/carer. Family friends, other parents, grandparents etc can collect but we require a parent with parental responsibility to inform the school office of this. Regular pick up arrangements should be put in writing to the school office.

Please continue to read with your child. They may be able to read it, but with good questioning you will ensure they have understood it too.

Home Learning

Spellings will be sent home weekly on a Friday and the children will be tested the following week.

Each week there will be a focus times table. This will be written in their homework/ reading diaries and they will be tested each week.


Every Friday, a piece of Maths homework will be sent home. This will be based on learning the children have completed that week or consolidating work they have previously studied. This is expected to completed in **pencil** and handed in the following week.
