




Maths	English	RE				
<p>In Maths, we will be learning about the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Multiplication and division • Length and height • Statistics 	<p>In English this half term, we will be reading 'The Odd Egg' by Emily Gravett and using this to write our own non-fiction reports. We will also read 'The Owl and the Pussycat' by Edward Lear and write our own persuasive letters.</p>	<p>Religion or World View Focus: Christianity Our enquiry question this half term is: What are the best symptoms of Jesus' death and resurrection at Easter?</p>				
<p>Science</p> <p>During our Science lessons this half term, the children will explore the human body, including the impact of diet and exercise. We will recap what we know about the five senses and carry out some simple tests. We will also observe the changing seasons as Winter becomes Spring and gather data on our trip to Ashridge during British Science week.</p>		<p>Computing</p> <p>In our Computing lessons, we will be using technology to collect and organise data and information. We will be creating pictograms to present this information through the use of technology.</p>				
<p>PE</p> <p>In PE this half term, we will continue our gymnastics lessons indoors with a focus on using the apparatus safely and in a variety of different ways. We will practise rolls such as log roll, egg roll and teddy bear roll. With the sports coach, the children will continue to work on their agility and fitness.</p>	<p>D.T.</p> <p>In D.T. this half term, we will be building structures in the form of castles, linked to our History topic. We will sketch their ideas before exploring ways of creating walls, turrets and drawbridges. The children will then paint their castles before evaluating their creations. Please could children bring in an empty cereal box to create their castles.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Our History topic this half term will be Castles. The children will discover what a castle is and why people built them. We will identify different parts of a castle and the hierarchy of different people who may have lived there. We will explore Berkhamsted Castle and its history.</p>				
<p>Music</p> <p>We will be using the 'Sing Up' programme to deliver our Music curriculum. We will listen to the musical pieces 'Who Stole my Chickens and my Hens'.
