2.	Attendance, school day, parking arrangements Rationale behind changes Safe parking and crossing Any challenges and solutions Mr Beach shared the rationale for the decision to change the school day hours based on the requirement for 32.5 hours. Some parents feel this has added stress onto the school day and increased traffic due to the shorter window in the mornings. A small number of concerns have been raised with the school. This has not been changed as we needed to allow time to implement fully. However, this meeting was an appropriate time to review. There was discussion about amending the timings at the start of the day. Mr Beach explained classroom doors cannot open earlier due to directed hours of staff. Mr Beach shared the rationale behind coming straight into school as this supported a smooth transition into school. If we opened the playground earlier, all children would need to be supervised and until the children come into the school building, parents would be responsible for the children's safety and welfare.	
	 Various options were discussed with the two main options being the following: 1) Main gate opens at 8:35 for all parents/carers with children in all year groups to gather on the playground. The bell will ring at 8:40 and the children will walk into school. Parents will be required to remain with their children/supervise them until they are in school. The gates will close at 8:45. As all children will come in via the main playground, no year groups will enter through the nurture room. 2) Year 3-6 enter from the Nurture room entrance at 8:40 & Nursery-Year 2 enter from the main gate (keeping things the same). However, Year 3-6 	Mr Beach to conduct a survey with all parents to review and vote

to wait inside the garden area to reduce congestion on the path outside. All gates/entrances will close at 8:45

Mr Beach shared that he has met with the local councillor, Mr Terry Douris and shared concerns about the lack of road markings and railings along Church Meadow. Therefore, it was shared about the need for railings outside exits/entrances and possible road markings to make this safer. There would need to be a consultation process, highways involvement and this will take some time. The change team plans to write letters in support of this. Crossing patrol completed a survey to see if we can have a crossing patrol attendant on Piper's hill to support crossing from the Garden centre. However, after the completion of the survey, we did not meet the criteria.

A discussion was had about attendance and punctuality and the possible impact this could have on our Behaviour and Attitudes judgement on our next inspection. Therefore, the robust systems introduced and raising the profile of attendance is to demonstrate action taken to improve the overall culture of attendance.

3. Clubs for Spring 2025

Parents reported that Dance club has been popular.

Parents would like more variety eg. Chess club, Gardening, rotating clubs termly and a range available for different ages. Mr Beach explained that the issue with offering clubs to only the lower or upper school is take-up in a small school. They have to reach certain numbers to be financially viable for the provider to run the club.

Parents shared that some clubs have been quite expensive and value for money was discussed.

Parents asked about the option for staff to run clubs. Mr Beach explained that in a small school, staff wear many different hats so their workload needs to be considered. In addition, clubs fall outside of the school day and therefore are not within directed time.

Mr Beach shared that we would like to grow our wrap around provision as when benchmarking with other schools in the local area, we provide less which is important for some parents. The school is looking into possible grants to support this. It will depend on staffing and uptake.



5. Parent survey results

Headlines & general feedback to be shared

We had a total of 30 responses overall.

Highlights

- 100% of parents either strongly agree or agree that the school promotes strong Christian values and ethos
- 100% of parents either strongly agree or agree that their child enjoys coming to school
- 100% of parents either strongly agree of agree that their child has a positive attitude towards their learning
- 97% of parents either strongly agree or agree that the school's vision has a strong impact on their child
- 100% of parents either strongly agree or agree the school has an inclusive and caring ethos
- 100% of parents either strongly agree or agree that behaviour is well-managed to create a calm safe environment.
- 100% of parents either strongly agree or agree that their child is well looked after
- 95% of parents that have raised a concern with the school either agree or strongly agree they felt listened to

Areas to focus on

- 43% of parents who have a child with SEND do not yet feel their child has the support they need to succeed
- 23% of parents feel their child does not have the opportunity to positively contribute to the wider community
- 23% of parents feel they are not aware of what their child is learning and the school's curriculum.
- 23% of parents feel collective worship is an important part of the day for their child.
- 10% of parents feel the school does not have high expectations for their child.
