This week, as a staff team, we have been having pupil progress discussions across the school. These help us to ensure our children access support needed for them to flourish.



Forest School

For our Forest school session this week, Year 5 and 6 enjoyed a trip to the woods. We learnt some of the basic skills needed for surviving in the wild.

We also looked at 5 key things that you would need to do in a survival situation and ranked them in order of importance.

- 1. Stay calm and assess your situation
- 2. Find or build a shelter
- 3. Find clean water
- 4. Start a fire
- 5. Collect food

We discussed why you would carry them out in this order using 'The Rule of 3'

- 3 minutes without air.
- 3 hours without shelter.
- 3 days without water.
- 3 weeks without food.

We spent the afternoon building shelters and making a 'fire in a tin.'

Year 1 and 2 had a brilliant time at the DSSN Multi-Skills event this week. They took part in activities including football dribble, speed stacking, beanbag noughts-and-crosses, throwing and catching, curling stones and even activities to practise their maths skills! The children were fabulous ambassadors of our school while they were there, being praised for their calm attitude and listening to the coaches.









In the classroom, the children have been just as busy. Our maths learning over the last week has been based around subtraction. We have practised our counting backwards as a class, as well as using our number bonds to help us with more challenging subtraction sums.

In Science, we began our Spring term topic on 'plants' with a nature walk and created a research page of what we already know. Currently, we are observing what happens to plants during the Winter months.
