You show your care for the land by sending rain; you make it rich and fertile. You fill the streams with water; you provide the earth with crops.







Spotlight on learning

This week we hear from Early Years! The children in Early Years have had a busy week learning all about Harvest. They have used their senses to explore different fruit and vegetables and developed their language describing them as well as sorting whether they grew under or above ground. The children did some printing with the vegetables and then harvested some of their own in our outside area, making sure to wash all the soil off them afterwards! The children explored weighing different vegetables and tried to get the scales to balance and estimate which would be heavier or lighter.



They had an exciting time making vegetable soup. They all had a turn peeling and chopping carrots and potatoes. The children noticed that before cooking the vegetables were hard and once cooked they became soft which told us they were cooked. They enjoyed watching the soup be blended and all made sure they blew on the soup before trying it. It was pretty unanimous that the soup tasted yummy and some children even asked for seconds! The children practised using words like; first, then, next, after that and finally to sequence the stages of making the soup and used their developing phonic knowledge to write about it.

We were very proud of the children taking part in the Harvest festival with the rest of the school and remembering the songs we had learnt to share.
