



Spotlight on learning


This week we hear from Year 5&6!

In Science we have been researching the planets in our solar system. We researched, drafted, and produced some very informative non-chronological reports. The children all choose their planet of interest and worked very hard.

We have now moved on to Phases of the Moon. We first learned about the different moon phases and enjoyed an art activity using a football and torch. The children sat in the dark hall in a circle and each drew the image they saw in front of them. When put together it showed all the moon phases and how the light from the sun reflects off the "moon" at different stages. We are now writing some explanation texts explaining the phases of the moon.







In Maths we have been converting units. We have been looking at lots of different units of measurement and strategies and knowledge needed to convert between them. The children also looked at metric and imperial measurements and categorised units into mass, length, and capacity. Great work!

During our History lessons, we have been researching information on the Ancient Maya civilisation – they have discovered when and where the Maya lived and have independently researched the belief system of the ancient Maya.

In English, we have been reading the text Curiosity, a book that details the journey of the Rover, Curiosity, to the planet Mars. We have been inspired by this book to write newspaper reports about the day of the landing.
