Religious life


On Monday, in collective worship, we reflected on Pentecost which was on Sunday 8th June. We explored different artistic interpretations as well as listening to the Bible story.














Spotlight on Learning




This week we hear from Miss Carty who is our English leader.

At Great Gaddesden School, we aim to offer an English curriculum that is diverse and engaging. We follow the Literacy Tree, an approach to the teaching of English that places children's literature at its core. This bookbased approach immerses children into literary worlds, creating strong levels of engagement to provide meaningful writing opportunities where the audience and purpose are clear. The children encounter a wide range of significant authors and a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts.

In **EYFS**, the children are exploring the book 'and Tango makes three' by Justin Richardson and Peter Parnell. Fitting with the setting of the story, the EYFS environment has transformed into a zoo! This week, the children have been exploring the provision and writing labels for the animal enclosures, feeding time posters and writing in role as the animals.





In **Year 1 & 2**, the children have read 'Last Stop on Market Street' by Matt de la Pena. They have used their senses to explore the different settings in the story and developed a wide range of vocabulary, then using this to write some brilliant group poems which they then shared with the class. This week, they have planned their own version of the story and have made a brilliant start at their own narrative writing.

In **Year 3 & 4**, the children are sharing the book 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner. This beautiful picture book follows a character finding a camera on the beach and discovering photographs of amazing underwater worlds. They have explored these settings and used a brilliant range of vocabulary to describe them in their writing. This week, they have written postcards to retell what has happened to them, practising their use of fronted adverbials.
