Spotlight on Learning

It has been a very busy time since returning after the Easter break. In English, we have started an exciting new unit of work based on the dystopian book 'Boy in the Tower' – as part of this unit, we have been exploring old film trailers from the 1950's to gather ambitious vocabulary.

During our learning in RE, we have been contemplating the idea of refuge and what makes us feel safe. We have linked this to the Buddhist belief in the Triple Refuge and how it helps them in their journey through life. We built wigwams to help demonstrate the idea of a safe refuge.

Our unit of work on collage has concluded, with the children completing a finished piece of work inspired by the Rainforest - a range of materials and techniques was used.

This week we started our new science topic on Evolution and Inheritance.


We talked about fossils and how they give us clues as to how animals and plants have changed and evolved over time. We also looked at how our characteristics such as hair colour and eye colour have been inherited from our parents. We analysed an image of two parents and drew predictions of what their children might look like based on their parents characteristics.
