



Maths	English	RE

<p>Our Science topic this half term will be ‘Everyday Materials’. E.g. magnetic, transparent, waterproof.</p>		<p>In Computing, we will be looking at IT networks around us. We will identify the uses of information technology within and beyond school. We will explain how these benefit us and explore how we can use them safely.</p>

<p>In PE this half term, our outdoor lessons will be led by the sports coach and will focus on movement, travel and ball skills. Indoors, the children will be participating in yoga, based on a variety of stories.</p>	<p>In Design & Technology, our focus will be on food technology.
