Spotlight on Learning

This week, we hear from Mrs Benson who leads Comptuing.



At Great Gaddesden we follow the Teach Computing scheme from Years 1-6. The long term plans are designed to ensure a progression of skills throughout the years and to build on prior knowledge. Each class covers 5 areas of learning : Computing Systems and Networks, Creating Media, Programming, Data and Information E-Safety. The units taught ensure a broad and balanced coverage of the National curriculum requirements, provide pupils with the opportunity to learn and apply transferable skills. The use of technology is on-going throughout EYFS. Children are exposed to some of the skills and equipment used in computing through linked provision and access to technological toys in the classroom. Some examples include: taking a photograph with a camera or tablet, searching for information on the internet and using google maps, playing games on the interactive whiteboard, using a Beebot (introduction to coding).

Here is what each year group has been learning:

In **Early Years**, the children have been using the Ipad to take photos of things that interest them around the school grounds that make them say "I wonder....". They have also been using the beebots to start to give simple directions.



In **Year 1 and 2,** the children have been developing their keyboard skills and learning how to use the space bar, delete button and return key.

In **Year 3 and 4**, they have been introduced to a new programming software called Scratch. The children have learnt to identify different programming command blocks, select the ones they want to use and see it come to life.





In **Year 5 and 6**, the children have been learning to use Google slides to present their independent research. Furthermore, they have also used the online tool 'Book Creator' to publish their dystopian stories written during English lessons
