Spotlight on learning

This week, we hear from Year 3 and 4.

Year 3 and 4 are really enjoying learning about The Stone Age. In our History lessons we have learnt what 'prehistory' means, we have found out what it means to be a 'hunter-gatherer' and we have created some amazing cave art using charcoal and pastels.

We had a lovely afternoon up at the forest school woods last week where we made a Stone Age camp! We built shelters using sticks and 'animal skins' (tarpaulins!) and we built campfires using moss, sticks and leaves. Whilst walking to the woods, were discovered objects that would have been useful to us during the Stone Age. Along the way we found blackberries, elderberries, nettles and hazelnuts which would all have been good food sources. We found a river which would have given us a water supply and we spotted stones and flints which would have been used to make different tools. The whole class were very enthusiastic and engaged with their learning and their behaviour during the trip was exemplary.







Forest school

At Forest School this week, the Y5 & 6 children were introduced to an Autumn classic - a game of conkers! They threaded string through their conkers, after using a palm drill to make a hole. Then the tournament commenced.

Congratulations to Leo F and Tommy who were our conker champions! The children also used the palm drills to make some fabulous conker creations: spiders, butterflies and a golden snitch!

Any donations of conkers gratefully received as our supplies are now depleted.

They also enjoyed painting with home-made elderberry and blackberry paint and creating a fantastic woodland restaurant.
