Spotlight on learning

This week, we hear from Early Years!

Our EYFS children have had fun investigating Winter this week. They have loved finding ice outside, dropping it and watching it shatter (and learning the word). They have created snowflakes in a variety of ways, using cutting skills, and using PVA glue, salt and water colour paint as well as creating them using loose parts. The children have created winter sticks using ribbon and wool to wrap round sticks. They have also made delicious looking hot chocolate in the mud kitchen and practised letter shapes in the 'snow'.







We have used the book Jack Frost and discussed what Winter is like, things we do in winter and what animals do. The children have experimented what would happen to ice when you add salt to it and tried to make it melt using warm water. They have used water colours and painted pictures on the ice as well as used their imagination to make up stories about the animals stuck in the ice and then had great fun trying to release them!
